

COMMISSIONER MEETING OF JANUARY 23, 2012

The Caribou County Commissioners met in regular session on January 23, 2012, at 9:00 a.m. Those in attendance were Lloyd Rasmussen, Commissioner Chairman, Earl Somsen Commissioner and Phil Christensen. Also in attendance were Caribou County Clerk Veda Mascarenas, Road and Bridge Supervisor Kim Spencer, Prosecuting Attorney Gregg Haney, Courthouse and Ground Supervisor Jordan Bodily, Indigent Director Denise Horsley, Building Inspector Ralph Hopkins, Sheldon Mansfield, Eldon Peck, Randy Prescott, Alan Skinner, Gary Sievers, Bill Jenkins, Jerry Hulse, Connie Petersen, JoAnn Rhodes, Charles Titcomb, Lance Hawk.

The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance and prayer.

Kim Spencer, Road and Bridge:

- Stock and hay trucks are parking on the roadway and cause a hazard. The board of commissioners will address the issue this summer and informed the ranchers and farmers.
- Mingo Bridge is done except the guard rail.
- Part time work this summer was approved by the board of commissioners.
- A position for Road and Bridge has come available. The board of commissioners will interview on February 27, 2012.
- Caribou County will try to piggyback with Bingham County for the summer asphalt.
- Painting center strips on county highways was discussed. The cost is approximately \$275.00/mi. No decision was made.
- Kim will continue to look for a replacement vehicle.

Ralph Hopkins, Building Inspector:

- Permits have been issued for one new potato building and two new agricultural buildings.

Scott Shuler, Weed Supervisor:

- More cloud seeding fuel has been bought. The price of fuel is getting very expensive. The association will purchase fuel early this year for next year.
- Scott requested to attend the Idaho Weed Association meeting in Boise on January 30 to February 2, 2012. The board of commissioners granted the request.
- Scott has met with his chemical representatives. The cost of chemical has increased about 3%. By purchasing the chemical in advance saves the county about \$500.00.

- A log will be kept on the areas sprayed that adjoin private property and kept on file.
- Scott requested that the weed shop be insulated and that a restroom be installed. The board of commissioners agreed with the insulation and made no decision about the restroom. Scott will referred to Ralph Hopkins about the restroom.

Denise Horsley, Indigent Director and Election Supervisor:

- .Release of liens was signed for 12-3; 12-4; and 2 on 11-34 by the board of commissioners.
- Lien on 12-11 was presented for signature by the board of commissioners.
- Commissioner Christensen moved to designate the polling places for the 2012 election year the same as 2011. Commissioner Somsen seconded the motion. The vote was Rasmussen - yes, Somsen - yes, and Christensen - yes.

Justin Steele, Probation:

- Justin presented the probation fees to board of commissioners for review. It has been determined by the Prosecuting Attorney that an ordinance is not necessary because the schedule does not exceed the guidelines of the Idaho Department of Corrections fee pursuant to I.C. 31-3201D.

Sheldon Mansfield, GIS:

- Sheldon presented a potential problem with the Freedom Fire District and the Bailey Creek Fire District boundaries. There are areas that border the district that are not included in the fire district which means that in case of a fire the Caribou County Fire Department will be dispatched to the location rather than the fire district being dispatched. There are no structures in Freedom Fire District as of this date. This information was found when Sheldon was doing the mapping and zoning of the districts for election purposes.

There are structures in the Bailey Creek Fire District. However, the Bailey Creek Fire District contracts with Caribou County Fire Department for fire protection.

Veda stated that it is the responsibility of fire district to annex the property to the existing fire district and present it to the Caribou County Board of Commissioners. The board of county commissioners requested that the commissioners of the fire districts meet with the county commissioners at the next meeting to try to discuss this issue.

City/County Meeting:

- Eldon Peck from Grace informed the board of commissioners about the beautification grant they are applying for and requested a letter of recommendation from the board of commissioners. The board of commissioners agreed.

- Jerry Hulse and Bill Jenkins discussed the snow removal on Lund Road. When the State plow turns around at the gravel station at the bottom of Fish Creek, they don't lift their blade on the plow leaving a berm in the road. Kim Spencer will talk with Idaho Department of Transportation about lifting the blade when they turn around at the bottom of fish creek.
- Alan Skinner and Randy Prescott requested the funds (\$194,000.00) that Caribou County had agreed to for the new septage receiving system. The board of commissioners directed that this be paid pursuant to the letter of July 1, 2011. They also reported that the project is going well.

Connie Petersen, Caribou Senior Citizen:

- Connie presented the yearend report for 2011 and thanked the board of commissioners for their support.

Other:

- Commissioner Christensen moved to pay the claims in the amount of \$266,341.47 and payroll claims in the amount of \$270,908.94, and to approve the minutes of January 9, 13, 19, 2012, commissioner meeting as presented. Commissioner Somsen seconded the motion. The vote was Rasmussen-yes, Christensen-yes and Somsen-yes.
- .The board of commissioners agreed to appoint Duayne Sims to the Caribou Memorial Hospital Board.
- The meeting adjourned at 4:30 p.m. The Caribou County Board of Commissioners will meet February 9, 2012, at 9:00 a.m. for regular meeting.
