

COMMISSIONER MEETING OF MARCH 26, 2012

APPROVED

The Caribou County Commissioners met in regular session on March 26, 2012, at 9:00 a.m. Those in attendance were Lloyd Rasmussen, Commissioner Chairman, Earl Somsen Commissioner and Phil Christensen. Also in attendance were Caribou County Clerk Veda Mascarenas, Road and Bridge Supervisor Kim Spencer, Caribou County Attorney Gregg Haney, Caribou County Treasurer Diane Crawford, Indigent Director Denise Horsley, Doug Hogan, Doug Wood, Sheldon Mansfield, Caribou County Sheriff Ric Anderson, Cindy Malm, David Sasser (via telephone conference), Terri Stephens, Aaron Cook, Garn Herrick, Shelley Reeves, Angie Mendenhall, Kenna Ann Moore, Valerie Lee, Craig Shuler, Tony Varilone, Lance E. Hawk and Curtis Thomas.

The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance and prayer.

Kim Spencer, Road and Bridge:

- Maggies Road is still being repaired.
- The railroad wants the board of commissioners to sign an agreement to allow the Railroad to install stop and yield signs at the county crossings. The board of commissioners will defer the decision until the county attorney has reviewed the agreement.

Ralph Hopkins, Building Inspector:

- Ralph discussed the proposed changes to the Caribou County Zoning Ordinance that the Planning & Zoning Commission passed May 4, 2011. The board of commissioners will review the changes and make a decision at the next commissioner meeting.

Jordan Bodily, Courthouse and Grounds:

- The silent bid surplus sale was completed. The result is as follows: Item #4 – EMS Building; Item #5 RaeAnn Prescott \$20.51; Item #6 4 Orange Chairs with wood trim \$25.01 Sharon Wells; Item #8 Wood desk \$15.00 Sharon Wells; Item #11 Cloth couch \$25.00 Sharon Wells; Item #14, Magazine Rack \$5.00 Cindy Bunderson. The rest of the items were not bid on and will be given to Senior Citizens.

Denise Horsley, Indigent Director

- Presented Cases # 2011-27, 2011-29, 2012-05, and 2012-09 for signatures of release of claim.

Diane Crawford, Caribou County Treasurer:

- Diane presented the two parcels of property that a tax deed will be taken for 2008 delinquent taxes. The affidavit will be filed March 26, 2012 and a tax deed will be taken on April 9, 2012 at 2:00 p.m.

Ric Anderson, Caribou County Sheriff:

- A jail standards presentation was presented to the board of commissioners by Ric Anderson, Cindy Malm, and Dave Sasser. The Jail Standards Committee may impose some more standards for the jails to meet certification. One of the proposed standards could be two detention officers will have to be present 24 hour a day. This could require additional employee(s) to meet the proposed standards.
- The sheriff suggested that the dispatch area could be moved out of the jail area. The board of commissioners took this under advisement and no decision was made.

Terri Stephens, Aaron Cook, Veda Mascarenas and Garn Herrock:

- Garn Herrock presented a rundown of how the title companies could access our network to get their information instead of personally coming to the courthouse to do their business.
- Veda Mascarenas discussed having a contract for each title company requesting to access the records and the contract having a set fee. Veda also stated that this will save employee time as well.
- Aaron Cook presented a legal problem with the net profit of mines being accessed by the public.
- Until the problem of the net profit of mines is resolved the board of commissioners will not enter into a contract with the title companies to access the land, tax and property records.

Craig Shuler:

- Craig inquired when the gate at 90%, Idaho Road Canyon and Swenson Canyon would be open. The board of commissioners informed Craig that the Swenson Canyon Road is not a county road past the gate. The board of commissioners will talk with the Bureau of Land Management and the Fish and Game about opening the gates by April 2, 2012.
- The trail issue from the Blackfoot River to the Agrium property was discussed. Commissioner Rasmussen informed Craig that John Tippetts has stated that he will make it a first priority when the snow is gone.
- Craig requested a letter of recommendation to the Bonneville Board of County Commissioners concerning the Winchell Dug-way Trail. Tony Varilone will prepare the letter for the commissioner's signatures.


Other:
