

COMMISSIONER MEETING OF APRIL 9, 2012

The Caribou County Commissioners met in regular session on April 9, 2012, at 9:00 a.m. Those in attendance were Lloyd Rasmussen, Commissioner Chairman, Earl Somsen Commissioner and Phil Christensen. Also in attendance were Caribou County Clerk Veda Mascarenas, Road and Bridge Supervisor Kim Spencer, Caribou County Attorney Gregg Haney, Courthouse and Grounds Jordan Bodily, Caribou County Trasurer Diane Crawford; Brenda Kelley, Marilyn Kukachka, Bob Kukachka, Julie Franson, Cody Franson, Levi Franson, Porter Franson, Diana Kilpatrick, Ron Kilpatrick, John Franson, Roslie Gier, Anthony Varilone, Wade Olorenshaw, and Terry Rindlibaker.

The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance and prayer.

Kim Spencer, Road and Bridge:

- The last one mile of the south end of Tygee Road is in bad shape. That portion of the pavement will have to be torn up and turned back to graveled.
- The agreement between the Union Pacific Railroad and Caribou County for the Statewide "Stop & Yield" sign program was signed by the board of commissioners.
- Oiling will begin the last two weeks of June
- Kim will contact the Bureau of Land Management and inform them that the Idaho Ranch gate will be open April 15, 2012.

Jordan Bodily, Courthouse and Grounds:

- Jordan discussed the proposal for the engineering company to do the Courthouse Structural Assessment. The board of commissioners agreed to proceed with the assessment.
- The outside flag light is being repaired.
- Jordan will contact the company that laid the carpet squares to have them redo some of the squares.

Denise Horsley, Indigent Director

- Presented Cases # 2012-17 for signature of lien.

Wade Olorenshaw and Terry Rindlibaker:

- Wade and Terry requested that the board of commissioners sign an administrative agreement between Caribou County and Farmers Land and Irrigation Canal Co. L.I.D. 2010-01. The board of commissioners entered into said agreement.

Glen Gibson – Black Canyon Clean Up

- Mr. Gibson explained the project that he and some other individuals have been working on in cleaning up the old dump site at Black Canyon. He requested that the board of commissioners waive the landfill fee. While the board of commissioners applauded the effort, the fee was not waived.

Ric Anderson, Caribou County Sheriff:

- Carl Toupin has agreed to work with the vessel and waterways area. The board of commissioners determined that an agreement or contract between Caribou County and Carl Toupin be prepared. The sheriff will invite him to the next commissioner meeting to discuss the agreement or contract.

Diane Crawford, Caribou County Treasurer:

- A hearing was scheduled this day for the 2008 Pending Tax Deeded Properties. No appearance was made on behalf of the properties. Caribou County took the tax deed on the properties belonging to Floyd Popa and Erwin Peck. Diane informed the board of commissioners that she will have the Tax Deeds recorded today.

Julie Franson:

- Levi Franson spoke to the board of commissioners and requested that the board of commissioners reconsider the recycling project.
- Dr. Franson spoke to the board of commissioners.
- Fifteen concerned citizen met with the board of commissioners to discuss what could be done to get the recycling program back into action. The board of commissioners informed the citizens that a committee has been appointed in an effort to try to resolve the issues that have arisen since the recycling program started. Other:

- Commissioner Christensen moved to pay the claims in the amount of \$208,662.91 and payroll claims in the amount of \$19,615.06, and to approve the minutes of March 15, 2012, commissioner meeting as presented and minutes of March 26, 2012 as amended. Commissioner Somsen seconded the motion. The vote was Rasmussen–yes, Christensen-yes and Somsen-yes.
- A letter from Rocky Mountain Power was received stating that \$1500.00 was being donated to the Caribou County Senior Citizens Center for the lighting project.

 - addition of 13.6 Fees for Conditional Use Permit;
 - addition of 14.6 Fees for Variance;
 - 22.6.1 Rule Waving the Reading of Ordinance on Three Different Occasions;
 - remove Chapter 21 and replace with Chapter 22 and;
 - decline the addition of 8.7 Wind Generation Facilities
- The board of commissioner adjourned the meeting and proceeded to the Caribou County Jail for the quarterly jail inspection.
