

COMMISSIONER MEETING OF FEBRUARY 11, 2013

The Caribou County Commissioners met in regular session on February 11, 2013 at 9:00 a.m. Those in attendance were Earl Somsen, Commissioner Chairman, Phil Christensen and Mark Mathews Commissioners. Also in attendance were Caribou County Clerk Veda Mascarenas, Caribou County Prosecutor Doug Wood, Road and Bridge Supervisor Kim Spencer, Indigent Director Denise Horsley, Weed Supervisor Scott Shuler, Landfill Supervisor Jason Lower, Lloyd Rasmussen, Caribou County Sheriff Rick Anderson, Public Safety Director Dennis Godfrey, Steve Harrison, and Duyane Sims.

The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance and prayer.

Kim Spencer, Road and Bridge Supervisor:

- Bingham County will bid on the 2013 oil today and Kim will let the board of commissioners know what the cost is next week.
- The heat bills in the shops were questioned. Kim will check on the cost of radiant heat for the shops and report back to the board of commissioners.
- The process of rock chipping and crack sealing was discussed.
- Snow removal on the Blackfoot River Road was discussed. No decision was made.

Ralph Hopkins, Building Inspector:

- Ralph reported on a locked gate in the Caribou Village Subdivision. This causes unpermitted construction and addressing issues when the gates are locked. It also causes a problem for fire and ambulance services.
- The issue of a non-sufficient funds returned check was discussed. Ralph was instructed to contact the bank to try to clear the check again before proceeding with any legal action.
- Ralph reported in 2012 that 68 permits with a value of \$51,393.00 were issued, 136 inspections were completed, and the new construction value was \$20,064,632.21.

Lloyd Rasmussen:

- Lloyd requested to be retained as a member of the TV Translator Board. The board of commissioners agreed and granted said request.

Scott Shuler, Weed Supervisor:

- Scott reported on the Weed Conference he attended: 1) ground spraying is more beneficial than aerial spraying 2) Caribou County has met the Environmental Protection Agency requirements 3) the Attorney General has stated that the weed supervisor has the authority to enforce the noxious

weed law and should work with the Sheriff's Department and the County Prosecuting Attorney, 4) a safety presentation was presented by Idaho County Risk Management Program, 5) a station will be set up at Bear Lake to check for invasive species, 6) gravel now has to be weed free, and 7) project funding for projects this year is approximately \$12,000 and the funding is available.

- The county weed poster contest is underway. This involves the students in the 6th grade in Soda Springs, Grace and Bancroft.
- Cloud seeding is still progressing. Approximately 145 gallons of fuel has been used.

Denise Horsley, Indigent Director:

- The board of commissioners signed the lien on application 2013-17.

Jason Lower, Landfill Supervisor:

- Jason would like to set a time to meet with the board of commissioners and discuss the landfill equipment needs and a way to handle the purchases or maintenance of the equipment.
- The preventive maintenance program is working well
- Jason requested to purchase a 2008 GMC Duramax for \$26,000.00. The board of commissioners stated that three quotes will be needed for any purchase over \$25,000.00.
- A dump truck will need to be purchased next year.

Rick Anderson, Caribou County Sheriff:

- Rick discussed the gun violence issue and a firearm policy for the courthouse. Also discussed was the requirement to comply with Jail Standards.
- March 25, 2013 will be a working lunch for the board of commissioners, sheriff and prosecuting attorney to discuss the compliance issue for the jail standard.
- The board of commissioners will also discuss the jail standards issue at the Four County Meeting on April 16, 2013.

Southeast Idaho Public Health:

- Leslie Talbot presented the quarterly report (October, November, and December 2012). It was noted that the month of October flu shots were given at the clinic, Grace and Bancroft and for the county employees at different locations. (see attached)

Dennis Godfrey Public Safety Director:

- At the request of the board of commissioners, Dennis explained the Regional Citizens Corporation Program Grant of which the county pays a portion of the grant and that portion is reimburse by the Federal Government. As money is spent, a copy of the claim is sent to the Federal Government and is then paid back to the county.

Other:

- Commissioner Christensen moved to pay the claims in the amount of \$238, 206.18 and payroll claims in the amount of \$135,522.79, and to approve the minutes of January 28, 2013 as amended. Commissioner Mathews seconded the motion. The vote was Somsen-yes, Christensen-yes and Mathews-yes.
- Commissioner Matthews moves to add Steve Harrison and Duyane Sims to the Agenda. Commissioner Christensen seconded the motion. The vote was Somsen-yes, Christensen-yes and Mathews-yes.
- Duayne Sims representing the Lions Club Distinguished Young Women requested a donation from the county to help support the program. Commissioner Mathews moved to donate \$250.00. Commissioner Christensen seconded the motion. The vote was Somsen-yes, Christensen-yes and Mathews-yes.
- Steve Harrison appeared at the request of the board of commissioners to discuss the claims against his fuel usage. The explanation was for a period of two months.
- The meeting adjourned at 5:00 p.m. The Caribou County Board of Commissioners will meet February 25, 2013, at 9:00 a.m. for regular meeting.
