

COMMISSIONER MEETING OF JUNE 10, 2013

The Caribou County Commissioners met in regular session on June 10, 2013 at 9:00 a.m. Those in attendance were Earl Somsen, Commissioner Chairman, Phil Christensen and Mark Mathews Commissioners. Also in attendance were Caribou County Clerk Veda Mascarenas, Road and Bridge Supervisor Kim Spencer, Indigent Director Denise Horsley, Cheryl Rasmussen, Jesse Anglesey, Lesley Talbot, Building Inspector Ralph Hopkins, Larry Weaver, Judge Mitchell Brown, Dennis Godfrey, Landfill Supervisor Jason Lower, Tom Seamons, and Tim Marks.

The meeting opened with the pledge of allegiance and prayer.

Kim Spencer, Road and Bridge:

- Penstock Bridge is now scheduled for 2018 but could be moved up. An error in the agreement for Caribou County's portion of the cost has been changed from \$774,003.00 to \$113,403.03.
- Chip sealing will be on June, 17, 2013.
- Commissioner Christensen moved to increase two part-time winter maintenance employees salaries to \$15.00/hr. and to pay the Christmas bonus for 2012 that was not paid. Commissioner Mathews seconded the motion. The vote was Somsen - yes, Christensen – yes, and Mathews – yes.
- The hopper feeder was discussed. Kim will check on bigger wheels for the trailer.

Leslie Talbot, Cheryl Rasmussen, and Jesse Anglesey:

Scott Shuler, Weed Supervisor:

- The White Top work day in Thatcher, and spraying of the landfill, fair grounds and camp ground, roadsides in Grace and Bancroft are complete.
- The Bag of Woad program will begin June 17, 2013. This is for kids up to the age of 16. Each bag is worth \$10.00.
- The Resource Advisory Commission (RAC) has decided to work on Gravel Creek Bridge, Pebble Creek area and the Rock Creek area.

Larry Weaver and Dennis Godfrey:

- The draft of Caribou County EMS Guidelines Administrative Transfer of Patients from Caribou Memorial Hospital to Home was presented to the board of commissioners.
- A request was made to buy 6 new defibrillators at a cost of approximately \$1650.00 each. The board of commissioners granted said request.

Denise Horsley, Indigent Director:

- Release of liens on case #'s 2011-24 and 2012-20 were signed.
- Commissioner Mathews moved to transfer the liquor license of the prior owner of Quik Stop to the new owner. Commissioner Christensen seconded the motion. The vote was Somsen - yes, Christensen - yes, and Mathews - yes.

Jayson Lower, Landfill Supervisor:

- Posishell is sending a different unit to the landfill.
- The landfill will purchase a compressor.

Tom Seamons and Tim Marks, Gem Plan Insurance:

- Tim Marks discussed the new health care plan. There will be a federal fee of \$5.25 per insured person per month plus a \$1.00 annual fee for each insured person. It is not know if the Gem Plan or Caribou County will incur this cost. He further stated he anticipated a 5% increase in the premium.

Other:


