

ORDINANCE NO. 85-1_____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CARIBOU COUNTY, IDAHO ESTABLISHING THE TIME PERIOD IN WHICH A DECISION MUST BE MADE FOLLOWING SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION FOR A LICENSE, A TRANSFER OR RENEWAL THEREOF FOR BEER AND/OR WINE: AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CARIBOU COUNTY, IDAHO AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The purpose of this ordinance is to establish a time period within which a decision must be made by the Board of County Commissioners following submission of an application to them for beer and/or wine license, transfer or renewal.

Section 2: The Board of County Commissioners shall act upon an application for a beer and/or wine license or a transfer or renewal thereof within thirty (30) days from the receipt of the application by the Board.

Section 3: The procedure for processing applications for beer and/or wine licenses and transfers or renewals thereof shall be governed by Chapters 10 and 13, Title 23, Idaho Code, where the same are applicable, and any rules and regulations promulgated by the Board of County Commissioners in accordance with Title 67, Chapter 52, Idaho Code.

Section 4: Whenever the Board of County Commissioners denies an application for a beer and/or wine license, the Board of County Commissioners shall specify in writing (a) the statutes, ordinances and standards used in evaluating the application, (b) reasons for denials, (c) the actions, if any, the applicant could take to obtain the license, transfer or renewal thereof.

Section 5: In any case where the Board of County Commissioners is considering an application for license, transfer or renewal thereof, a transcribable, verbatim record of the proceedings shall be made. If the application for a license, transfer or renewal is denied, a transcribable, verbatim record of the proceedings shall be kept for a period of not less than six (6) months after a final decision on the matter. Upon written request and

within the time period provided for retention of the record, any person may have the record transcribed at his expense. Minutes of the proceedings shall also be kept by the Clerk of the Board and retained indefinitely or as otherwise provided by law.

Section 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

Section 7: Any ordinance or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
