## GET OUT AND VOTE

The Governor and the Secretary of State had some difficult decisions to make regarding the May Primary. The decision to make the May Primary an all-mail out absentee election was made in the best interest of the voters, and the poll workers. As the Clerk for Caribou County I would like to thank the residents of the County for their understanding and patience during this unpredictable time. The Clerk's Office has been working hard to make sure that the changes in this year's primary election are working smoothly, and that every voter gets the right to vote. As of Friday May 8<sup>th</sup>, the Clerk's Office has mailed out 1636 ballots. If you have not requested a ballot or you need to register to vote for the Primary Election you can go online at [Idahovotes.gov](http://Idahovotes.gov) or come to the Clerk's Office at 159 South Main Soda Springs, ID Room 202. New voter registrations and the request for a ballot must be received by the Clerk's Office no later than May 19<sup>th</sup> at 8:00 p.m. Once a request is made the Clerk's Office will then mail the ballot to the voter. The voter can mail in their ballot or return their ballot in person to the Clerk's Office. All ballots must be received in the Clerk's Office by June 2<sup>nd</sup> at 8:00 p.m. You need to be sure to allow enough time for the mail. So, if you have any doubt your best option is to bring your voted ballot to the Clerk's Office. The State has sent out request forms so if you have one you may use it if you have not already requested a ballot. Just be sure it is mailed in time to reach the Clerk's Office by May 19<sup>th</sup> or bring it into the office so your ballot can be mailed to you in time to vote and have it returned by June 2<sup>nd</sup> at 8:00 p.m.
