

ORDINANCE NO. 98-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF CARIBOU, STATE OF IDAHO, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 95-1, ORDINANCES OF CARIBOU COUNTY, IDAHO, SPECIFICALLY SECTION 5.2 OF SAID ORDINANCE TO REQUIRE THAT ANY PERSON DELIVERING ANY WASTE TO THE SANITARY LANDFILL WHICH WASTE IS NOT COVERED OR SECURED SHALL PAY A FEE OF \$10.00 TO THE LANDFILL OPERATOR; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCE IN CONFLICT WITH THIS ORDINANCE, AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CARIBOU COUNTY, IDAHO, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Section 5.2, Ordinance No. 95-1, ordinances of Caribou County, Idaho, is hereby amended to add the following language thereto:

5.2 It shall be unlawful for any person transporting solid waste over public streets, roads, alleys, or right-of-ways to do so without providing a cover and/or securing to the vehicle all solid waste being transported. Covering loads of solid waste shall be for the purpose of preventing the scattering, blowing, or loss of said solid waste so transported.

Any person or entity delivering waste to the sanitary landfill which is unsecured or uncovered shall pay a fee of \$10.00 to the landfill operator at the time of delivery of said waste in addition to any other fees which may be assessed against the person or entity delivering said waste at the time of delivery. If said person or entity fails to pay the same to the landfill operator, he shall not be entitled to deposit the waste at the landfill, and said person or entity shall be issued a citation pursuant to Section 6.2 of this ordinance for violation of the same.

Section 2: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repeal.

Section 3: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication according to law.
